




Reflect for a second: *how did you end up at church? Did you just wander in the door one day? Did you simply pick a place of worship at random?* Probably not! In *most* cases (about 90%), people start going to church *because someone else invited them.* Maybe you started attending because you're parents brought you. Perhaps a co-worker encouraged you to come

along. Maybe a friend or relative or neighbor said to you, "Why not try coming with me next Sunday?"

September 15th we'll be celebrating "Back to Church Sunday." *If you've* been meaning to invite friends, family, coworkers, or neighbors to church, Sept. 15th is the day!



Who will you invite?

If you've never considered doing that before, *why not?* Are you afraid that they might say, "No way!" It's true – they *might*. But 47% of Americans tell researchers they'd be willing to visit church *as long as it's with a friend*. Those are pretty good odds! (continued)

What's more, *Christ calls us to this and promises us his help in it.* He says, "Go and make disciples of all nations.... And surely *I am with you always* until the very end of the age!" Think of that. When you go to invite a friend or neighbor to church this fall, you can be assured that *Jesus goes with you*; you are doing his work with him!

Another common reason we don't invite people to church is

fear that doing so is judgmental, "holier-than-thou," or pushy. We reason, "Who am *I* to tell them what to believe?" If you resonate with that thought, I encourage to you think about sharing your faith and your church in a new light. When you share what Christ has done for you, you're not demonstrating how good *you are*, but how great *Christ is*. In




the hymn we sing, "To God be the glory, great things he hath done!" If I know that God has done great things for me, I can share that not out of a desire for self-promotion, but so that God will do great things for my neighbors, friends, and co-workers too! I love how Martin Luther put it, "We are all mere beggars showing other beggars where to find bread."
