I Believe: The Resurrection of the Body



Death is the fundamental human problem. In ending our lives, it casts deep when all projects turn to ash? Why love a name" that will inevitably be forgotten by future generations? The reality of

death means your life is no more enduring than a name fading away on a weathered grave-marker.

Many believe that God has offered a "solution" to this problem, namely, that Jesus is offering tickets to heaven. Yes, you'll die, but at least your disembodied spirit can go on floating about. (I have to ask: "How good of a 'solution' is it that throws the daisies and the diamonds, the Grand Canyon and the geckoes, the mountains and the moose – and every human form – into the dustbin of eternity?")

So against the fatalism that says, "Death is the end," and the pseudo-Christianity that says, "you can hope in a disembodied, spiritual heaven," the Apostles' Creed says, "I believe in the resurrection of body." My body. Your body. The physical creation.

The entire Creed takes the physical world (including our physical bodies) very seriously. God is the "Maker" of heaven and earth. Jesus, the Son of God, became a man, lived an embodied human life, died an ordinary human death, and then his physical body was raised up on the third day. The tomb was empty, remember? A big part of the New Testament message is that Jesus didn't leave his body behind, and neither will you.

Paul, in 1 Corinthians 15, promises that as Jesus was raised, we too shall be raised together on that great, coming Resurrection Day. Paul uses the image of a seed: a seed is the same as the tree it becomes, yet also very different, more glorious, more able, more beautiful, perfected. Likewise, there will be continuity between your present life and the future life, but we have the promise that our physical forms will be perfected, made better than we can imagine. Paul writes elsewhere that Jesus "...will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body" (Phil 3:21).

So what? First, our coming resurrection should give us hope. Death isn't the end. No beauty is ultimately lost. No life is pointless. God will redeem his creation and renew all who are in Christ.

Second, our future resurrection is part of God's grand restoration project of the cosmos. This fact should give us endurance in caring for the physical creation. Just as the promise that I will one day be perfected in Christ is an encouragement to keep making progress in my present life, so the promise that God will restore his entire creation should be an encouragement to be good stewards of the water and land, skies and animals we have in our care. No good work will be wasted; your actions are genuinely meaningful today and in God's eternity.
