I ran across this husband-and-wife story from a 1930s Chicago newspaper. The article, "Man Spites His Wife by Staying Blindfolded in Bed Seven Years." reads as follows:

The strange story of Harry Havens of Indiana, who went to bed – and stayed there – for seven years with a blindfold over his eyes because he was peeved at his wife, was revealed here today when he decided to get out of bed. Havens was the kind of husband who liked to help around the house – hang pictures, wipe the dishes, and such. His wife scolded him for the way he was performing one of these tasks, and he resented it. He is reported to have said: "All right. If that's the way you feel, I'm going to bed. I'm going to stay there the rest of my life. And I don't want to see you or anyone else again." His last remark explains the blindfold. He got up, he explained, when the bed started to feel uncomfortable after seven years.

Ah, the lengths we go to hold on to a grudge!

In teaching us how to pray, Jesus says, "Pray like this, 'Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors." It might seem odd to speak of "indebtedness" to God, but Jesus once said that the greatest commandment is, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your strength and with all your mind." In other words, you *owe* God all the love of your heart, strength, and mind. With any failure to love God — which is nothing but lack of trust — you take out a great, unpayable mortgage on your life.

Yet God – out of grace – forgives the debt. Paul says, "God forgave us all our sins, having canceled the charge of our legal indebtedness, which stood against us and condemned us; he has taken it away, nailing it to the cross" (Col 2:14). Jesus' cross is the only reason we can pray, "Forgive us our debts." (continued)

But remember the second half of this prayer, "As we forgive our debtors." Does that mean that Jesus only forgives us if we forgive others first? What a terrifying thought! Have you perfectly forgiven everyone who's hurt you? Right after teaching the Lord's Prayer, Jesus reiterates the point, saying, "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins" (Matt 6:14-15). What could this mean? Is Jesus saying that God's forgiveness has to be earned by forgiving others?

No. The Bible is pretty clear that we are saved by God's grace, not our own efforts. (See Eph. 2:8-9.) Forgiveness is a gift we receive. But think about that for a second: how do you receive a gift? With open hands. And how do you give a gift? With open hands. Do you see it? When it comes to forgiveness, "getting" and "giving" have the same posture!

So when Jesus links our getting forgiveness and our giving forgiveness, he's highlighting the fact that only when our hearts are in position to forgive can we be forgiven. We simply cannot demand mercy for ourselves and justice for others! The surest sign that your sins are forgiven is that you forgive others their sins against you.


