#### "Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was Crucified, Dead & Buried"

"The founder of my society was tried by the second district court, convicted, hung by the neck until dead and buried in the potter's field." Are those words a little shocking? I hope so, because they reflect some of the original offense that this month's line of the

Apostles' Creed once carried, before being worn down by frequency and familiarity. While we sometimes wear a cross as jewelry, to the ancient Romans (and the first Christians), the cross was the symbol of the most horrible executions – much like a gallows or an electric chair. The creed also takes care to stress that this was a judicial killing; Jesus was executed by Governor Pilate, the legal authority in first century Judea. (The Creed takes it as significant that Jesus didn't die of old age or at the hands of a mob.)

But when we consider the truly scandalous nature of what we're saying in this part of the Apostles' Creed, I expect we sometimes wonder, "Why focus so much on this death stuff? Isn't God about hope and love and peace? Why dwell on the blood and the suffering of Jesus of Nazareth? The one-time Episcopal Bishop of Newark, John Shelby Spong writes, "To speak of a Father God so enraged by human evil that he requires propitiation for our sins that we cannot pay and thus demands the death of the divine-human son as a guilt offering is a ludicrous idea to our century. The sacrificial concept that focuses on the saving blood of Jesus that somehow washes me clean is by and large repugnant to us today. To view human life as depraved or as victimized by sin is to literalize a premodern anthropology."

While Spong may be right that talk of sin is frequently perceived as backwards, the Bible unapologetically and repeatedly says the human family - created for intimate fellowship with God - rejected his love, spurned his commandments, and rebelled against him. In a word, "sinned." Listen to God's heart as he aches over our rebellion, "Your love is like the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears" (Hos 6:4) We are like little children, led by a loving father who holds our little hands; yet as soon as we can walk on our own, we kick him down and spit in his face (see Hos 11:1-4). The result? According to the prophet Ezekiel, "The soul that sins shall die" (18:4).



Yet God did not give up on humanity! In the Old Testament, God provided a *sacrificial ritual system* for maintaining close friendship with God. (That's what Leviticus is all about!) Via *animals'* deaths (sacrifice), people could stay close to God. A worshipper approaching the temple would lay his or her hand upon the lamb's head, *symbolically placing his guilt upon the lamb*, then letting the priests sacrifice it. The idea being, "*This animal dies in my place*."

But wait – I see two big problems with this concept! First: what kind of a God would be happy with me because I've killed him a wooly lamb? Second: if God is loving, why doesn't God just forgive me?

On that first problem: the Old Testament sacrificial system was never meant to be "effective" in and of itself. Simply killing a lamb didn't make God happier with you. Just note the many places in the Old Testament where God gets *upset* with people for going through the rituals when their hearts were far from him (e.g. Amos 5:21). Rather, the animal sacrifices in the Bible are really more like *teaching aids*. Rather than "changing God's mind about us," the sacrifices teach women and men about the *severity of sin* and the *infinitely high cost* (a life!) of reconciliation. (See Hebrews 10:1-4). The old sacrifices taught God's people that a sacrificial substitute was for forgiveness.

But that only brings us back to the second problem: why doesn't God just forgive me? Why do we need that substitute? Short Answer: because God loves you; and all life-changing love is a substitutional sacrifice. I was reading about a foster family this past week. These parents love their children; but think of the sacrifices they've had to make! They've lost free time and privacy; money and energy; they've given it all for these young people. Do you see the substitution? The parents have grown smaller so that these young people might grow greater. They give that these children might get. Why? Love – plain and simple.

The beating heart of Christianity, recorded in these shocking words about Christ's execution at the hands of Pilate, is that because God is a God of love, he became personally involved in your weakness, your sin, your grief, your need. God came to us as a man, Jesus of Nazareth, and all your "junk" flowed into him and he bore it on the cross – the cross that you legally deserved. And in exchange he gave us his life.




