

# **Getting Ready to Grow**

One of my favorite summer-time activities is gardening.

In our back-yard plot the family and I tend raspberries, strawberries, various onions, hot peppers, tomatoes, carrots, potatoes, and herbs. Before planting seeds or starts, I start each spring by breaking up the ground and mixing in manure or compost. It's hard, physical work (we do it by hand), but we persist because we know it's necessary for a flourishing garden.



It takes a little while (so I have plenty of time to think!) and as I twist my hand-tiller in the winter-hardened earth, my mind often wanders to a passage in Hosea 10: "Break up your unplowed ground; for it is time to seek the Lord, until he comes and showers his righteousness on you"(v. 12). The prophet Hosea isn't talking about literal ground, but the soil of our hearts. A favorite image in the Bible for God's people is a certain type of gar-



den: a vineyard (For example, see Isaiah 5, Matthew get choked by weeds or dried up by drought. Here Hosea is calling us to prepare for God's blessing in our lives by breaking up our sin-hardened boott

That's what Lent – and it's first day: Ash Wednesday – is really all about. We prepare our garden for growth. We prepare our hearts for growth by seeking the Lord clearing out the debris from our hearts. Come for Ash Wednesday Worship on Wed., March 6 at 7:15-7:45pm

#### The Palms in Our Windows




Some of the artistic symbolism in the Bible – and our church's stained-glass windows – have incredibly ancient roots that point us into the future. For example, in one the Bible's earliest stories, we see God *walking in the garden of Eden* with Adam and Eve. The garden was the

well-watered and fruitful place of God's presence with us, the place of worship, the place of communion.

So it should come as no surprise that when King Solo-

mon constructed the first temple (about 1000 BC) he filled it with gardenimagery. For example, his workmen carve "...palm trees and open flowers on the paneling and overlaid them with gold hammered evenly over the carvings" (1 Kings 6:35). The temple in Jerusalem was meant as the new Eden, the new place where God and humanity could meet and walk hand-in-hand.





But he prayed that the temple he built would be a gathering place for the people of God to meet with God and worship together (1 Kings 8:27-30). Likewise, we know that our "sanctuary" is not the dwelling place of God, but reminds us of God's presence in Eden and God's presence with us now through Jesus Christ and his Holy Spirit.

It also reminds us of the *future*. What? Our worship-space should remind us of the *future*! For example, the windows are filled with garden-imagery – deliberately echoing the pictures in the temple (palms and open flowers), which were themselves echoing the fruitful garden of Eden! But the biblical story of "the garden" is one that isn't quite finished! What do find in the very conclusion of the Bible? The final chapter (Revelation 22) pictures our salvation as (continued)

(continued) a return to a restored Garden of Eden: "Then the an-


gel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month! And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations" (Rev. 22:1-2). It's a restoration of the



divine / human fellowship in Eden, for in this eternal city-garden, "They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God" (Rev. 21:3).

So when we gather for prayer, praise, sacraments, and fellowship in our sanctuary, may our stained-glass windows remind you: that though God does not dwell in houses built by human hands, he is present with us through the Spirit's power, that Christ has performed the work of the redemption, and that the final *restoration* is on its way: the best is yet to come.




