

Pastor's Pen

I come from a long line of worriers. From my mother I inherited an inability to sleep until I've resolved what's on my mind – or at least written it down! From my grandfather I gained a tendency to give every ache, pain, and cough the most serious diagnosis!

Yet the truth is, this sort of worry is born of a deep-seated self-reliance. In the book of Exodus, the Lord provided for his people's needs: giving them water, preserving their clothing, and showering bread from heaven each night that the people called, "manna." Moses told the people to gather just enough manna for one day because God would send more for the next.

But there were some worriers among the people of Israel. The said, "Yes, yes, Moses. But *what if* the manna doesn't come tomorrow? *What then!*? Better safe than sorry!" So, the people *stockpiled* the manna – and by the next morning, "it was full of maggots and stank."

In the wilderness, God taught the people to trust in him day by day – by giving them their *daily bread*. Likewise, Jesus teaches us to pray, "Give us today our daily bread." When Jesus says, "bread" he means *all that we need for our physical lives:* food, medicine, shelter, community, etc. And by teaching us to ask for our *daily* bread, he teaches us to rely on God for what we need *every day of our lives*.

Just like those ancient Israelites hoarding manna, we too want to rely on ourselves. We fill our freezers and our bank accounts against a rainy day. We buy milk and bread before blizzards.

While those behaviors are probably wise and prudent, we must never forget the fact that we are dependent on God for every blessing in our lives. When Jesus calls us to pray, "Give us this day our daily bread," he's teaching us that the Christian life is always lived one day at a time. Jesus is calling us to *live by faith* – to daily put our needs in his loving hands and trust him to provide for us. He is more than able!

To pray for daily bread is to pray, "Lord, today *I have you*. And you have what I need. Tomorrow it will be the same.

I will have you and you will have all I need. So Lord, give me *today* what I need *today* and help me be thankful for all your blessings in my life."
